

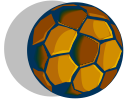
Family Fun

Section D (Stretch Your Imagination)

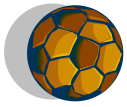
Festivals, games and places are important in Singapore's historical landscape. They are there in common memories of those that live through, and on the lips when telling the younger generation of the yesteryears.
